

Saturday, Dec. 30th. Commences with fresh breeze from S.E. at 5 P.M. Double reefed the Topsails, at 9 P.M. took in the Jib & Main Sail, Strong Gale through the night latter part wind hauled to the S. and moderate some let one reef out the Topsails and set the J.G. Sail.
Lat. by obs. 37-22 S. - - Long. by Chron 26-34 E.

Sunday, Dec. 31st. Commences with fresh breezes from S.W. Steering S.E. by E. at 3 P.M. had a heavy squall, tore the Jib Jibb and J.P. Sail at 8 P.M. Discovered the Bar. to be very low 28 $\frac{25}{100}$ had not fell before for 2 month or more, been up to the top of tube all the while considered her good for nothing, the mean time a tremendous heavy swell rolling up the same time I supposing a very Gale of wind or a Hurricane approaching, at 9 P.M. hove to under a close reefed Main Topsail and Spencer heading to the S.W. at midnight turned up the lee Boats and got as snug as possible blew quite heavy through the night but nothing alarming at daylight more moderate Steered S.E. under short sail a very heavy swell on and the Bar. still down so ends the Day -

Monday, Dec. 2nd. at 1 P.M. set Topgallantsails over Single reefed Topsails, at 4 P.M. under Double Reefed Topsails, Winds from S.W. and heavy squalls at times, at other times quite moderate latter under Single reefs Steering S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. by Compass, Barometer 28 $\frac{45}{100}$ at the lowest through the Day. Lat. by obs. 38-02 S. - - Long. by Chron 31-49 E.

Tuesday, Dec. 3rd. Commences with strong winds from W. S.W. Steering S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. at 1 P.M. set the Topgallantsails, at 4 P.M. under all Sail Bar. 28 $\frac{45}{100}$ latter part winds from S.W. and pleasant employed in getting out a new Main Topsail and fitting it to her -
Lat. by obs. 37-46 S. - - Long. by Chron 35-20 E.

Wednes. Dec. 4th. Strong Gale from S.W. and Squally at 1 P.M. bent a new M.P. Sail and Fore Sail, Steering on diff. Courses to the Eastward most of the time M.P. Sail set over a Single reefed M.P. Sail.
Lat. by obs. 37-12 S. Long. by Chron 39-40 East. -

Thursday Dec. 5th. Winds from S.W. and equally Steering S.E. by E. most of the time under all Sail
Lat. by obs. 38-26 S. - Long. by Chron 42-53 E.

Friday Dec. 6th. fresh breezes from W. S.W. to W. S.W. and equally Steering to the Eastward most of the time under all Sail Studding sails set below & drift employed in Sail mending Lat. by obs. 38-19 S. Long. by Chron 46-39 E.

Saturday Dec. 7th. Commences with strong winds from W. S.W. to S.W. and very squally at 4 P.M. Double reefed the Top sails heavy squalls of wind and rain turned up the lee Boats and went down the fore Topgallantsail, got all ready for a heavy Gale at midnight moderate latter under M.P. Gallantsail weather very unsteady sometimes blowing very hard at other times quite moderate Lat. by obs. 38-17 S. Long. by Chron 50-12 E.

Sunday Dec 8th. first part fresh breezes from S.W. and equally Middle and latter part moderate winds with light Showers of Rain Lat. by obs. 38-22 South.
Long. by Chron. 53-00 East.

S.W. by Compass, at 4 P.M. more moderate set Double reefed Topsails Jib and Main Sail and Steered S.E. winds from S.W. and equally Lat. by obs. - 37-57 S.
