

Thursday Jan. 30th. First part fresh breezes from S.E. steering to the N.W. by the wind under all sail latter part strong winds under Double reefed Topsails Jib and Main sail in, at 9 Am. wore ship to the Eastward Winds from the S.W. E. and thick weather S's obs. Lat. by acc 36-34 S. Long. by Chrs. 170-45 E.

Friday Jan. 31st. Commenced with strong winds from the S. and Cloudy heading E.S.E. under Double reefs, at 5 P.M. hove to under a Close reefed Main. Topsail, Middle part heavy Gales from S. to S.W. and Raining at 4 Am. moderate at 5 So. set Double reefed Topsails, at 11 So. under all sail steering S.W. E. fresh breezes from W. S.W. and a heavy swell on Lat. by obs 36-14 S. Long. by Chrs. 170-05 E.

Feb. 1st. All these 24 hours fresh breezes from the Westward and smoky steering to the North Eastward under all sail at 11 Am spoke the Brig Daniel Watson of Sydney 8 ms. out 100 bbls Sp. built another sail in sight ahead steering about S. S. E. Lat. by obs 34-30 S. - Long. by Chrs. 171-45 E.

Feb. 2nd. Commenced with Winds from S. W. by W. steering to the North Eastward at 3 P.M. the three Kings bore S. W. 10 mi. Dis. at 4 spoke the Ship Olimpia 40 ms. out 1000 bbls sp. North part of New Zealand - land bearing S. S. E. 10 mi Dis thick strong Winds and equally steering on different courses the night under Short sail lying aback part of the time, at 4 Am steered S. for 10 So. the ship led to the S.W. blowing a Gale, at 8 Am the outer head of bore S. 10 mi. Dis -

Feb. 3rd. Commenced with strong Winds from S.W. steering to the S.E. by the wind at 5 P.M. of Mangarua 2 mi Dis from the Entrance of the Harbor wind moderate and veered to the S. tacked to the Westward lying under easy sail through the night on Diff. tacks under the lee of the land 2 mi. Dis at 5 Am. made all sail at 11 So. came to anchor at Mangarua, where I found the Ship Mount Vernon and the Bark Wm. S. Wheaton

Feb. 4th. light winds from the S. and fine weather set. hart employed in cleaning ship, latter part employed in putting up Shooks rafting water back on shore &c.

Feb. Wednes. 5th. Civil acc. All hands variously employed at 8 Am. I punished James Weber for abusing the 2nd. and 3rd. officers yesterday punished him until he acknowledged he was wrong, and promised to do so no more; 3 day. with a small fine to make the Viliu quiet -

Thurs. 6th. fine weather employed in watering ship &c.

Friday 7th. fine weather variously employed

Sat. Feb. 8th. fine weather employed in painting ship &c. one watch on liberty

Sunday Feb. 9th. one watch on liberty

Monday Feb. 10th. employed in painting ship &c. one watch on liberty

Tuesday Feb. 11th. employed in taking wood and water one watch on liberty

Wednesday Feb. 12th. employed in taking recruits onboard one watch on liberty

Thurs. Feb. 13th. variously employed one watch on liberty

Friday Feb. 14th. employed in tiding the ship by the head and stopping a leak in her stern one watch on liberty

Saturday Feb. 15th. employed in getting all ready for sea one watch on liberty

Sunday Feb. 16th. All hands onboard and all ready for sea
