

Tuesday March 18th. fresh trades from S.E. to E.S. and fair Steering S.W. under all sail in Co. with Ship Marcia Lat. by obs. 23-03. Long. by Chro. 157-54 W.

Wednesday March 19th. Strong Winds from S.E. and equally, at half past 5 P.M. made Mangia leaving S.W. at 8 Do. came to with the head yards aback took in the light sails, at 8 Am. came to under the lee of the Island and went in trading with two Boats Anchored the Boats outside the reef, there being no landing for Boats, employed the Natives with Canoes to load the Boats on the W. S.W. part of the Island Ship Marcia, Frances & Condor here trading same time

Thursday March 20th. first fresh breezes from S.E. and equally, employed in getting recruits onboard viz. Pigs, Plantin, Bananas, Oranges, Limes, Purkeas, & also Ship 2 Kanakhas, at 1/2 past 5 P.M. all on board Steered S.W. 1/2 S. under all sail, at 9 Do. Winds from S.E. and equally took in the light sails, at 11 Do. had a heavy squall got the Bark under Double reefed Topsails, and Main sail in, latter part more moderate at 8 Am. under all sail, at 11 Do. took in the Top & Single reefed the Topsails

Friday March 21st. Strong Winds from S.E. and equally, Steering to the Northward mostly under Single reef & Pappallaneails set over, 2 Ships in sight
Lat. by obs. 18-10 S. Long. by Chro. 160-42 W.

Saturday March 22nd. First part Strong Winds from S.E. Steering S.W. by S. at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Frances of S.B. Middle part light winds from the Eastward and equally with light Showers of Rain, latter part fresh breezes and pleasant, Steering S.W. employed in breaking out for Staps and serving them out to the Crew
Lat. by obs. 16-39 S. - Long. by Chro. 161-52 West.

Sunday March 23rd. brisk winds from E. Steering S.W. by E. under all sail weather fine and pleasant.
Lat. by obs. 14-30 S. Long. by Chro. 162-13 W.

Monday March 24th. fresh breezes from E. first part fair middle and latter part equally with showers of Rain
Lat. by obs. 12-25 S. Long. by Chro. 162-19 West.

Tuesday March 25th. Winds from E. with heavy squalls of wind and rain, Steering S.W. part of the time under all sail at other times under Short sail at 1/2 past 5 P.M. made Little's Island bearing S.E. by E. 1/2 E. 20 ends in Co. with the Frances Lat. by obs. 12-25 S. Long. by Chro. 162-28 West.

Wednesday March 26th. Winds from the E. and equally attended with much Thunder and heavy gusts of wind and rain, most of the time under reefed Topsails in passing Flint Island supposed we saw land but could not ascertain being and thick and rainy to windward 20 ends in Co. with the Frances Lat. by obs. 8-49 S. Long. by Chro. 162-53 W.

Thursday March 27th. Winds from E. and equally Steering to the Northward at 5 P.M. spoke the Ship Frances, at 8 oon Lat. by obs. 7-17 S. - Long. by Chro. 163-14 W. -
Dis. 64 - Moon W. - Long. by Lun. 163-17 West

Friday March 28th. Brisk Winds from E.S. Steering S.W. by S. Middle part under Single reefed Topsails latter part employed in serving Main Sanyards and setting up the Main Rigger Lat. by obs. - 5-07 South. - Long. by Chro. 164-50 West. -

Saturday March 29th. moderate Winds from S.E. Steering S.W. by S. by the wind variously employed on the Rigger Lat. by obs. 3-36 S. - Long. by Chro 166-00 W.
