

Friday May 2nd. First and Middle part Strong Winds from N.E. Steering to the Northward by the wind under Double Reefed Topsails, at 5 Am. saw a Right Whale and lowered the Boats, at 10 Do. saw another and lowered without success. Fresh breezes and Snow Storms ends the Day. Lat. by obs. 53-22 N. Long. by Chron. 168-34 E.

Saturday May 3rd. Strong Winds from N.E. first part thick Snow Storm, Middle part squalls of Snow, and frosty plenty of Ice about the Sails and Rigger. Latter part much the same, saw a Right Whale to suggest to lower. Steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double Reefs through the Day, and Short Sail through the Night. Lat. by obs. 53-24 N. Long. 168-36 E.

Sunday May 4th. First and Middle part Strong winds from the Northward attended with Snow, and considerable of Ice about the Rigger and Decks. Steering on Diff. tacks under easy Sail, at 7 Am. spoke the Ship Alert of New-England 10 1/2 m. out 130 bbls (70 St.) Latter part moderate Winds from N.E. Steering to the N.E. by the wind. saw another Ship to the leeward. Lat. by obs. 53-34 N. Long. by Chron. 168-42 E.

Monday May 5th. First and Middle part Winds from the Northward Steering to the Eastward by the wind under Double Reefs, plenty of Snow, and freezing Cold plenty of Ice about Deck. Latter part light Winds Steering to the Westward lowered for a Right Whale. Lat. by obs. 54-02 N. Long. by Chron. 169-51 E.

Tuesday May 6th. Fresh breezes from N.E. W. to N.W. Steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double Reefed Topsails at 4 P.M. saw the Ship Alert take a Whale at 5 Am. made Bhering's, N.E. Copper I. bearing N.W. or thereabouts, the weather freezing Cold, N.E. obs. At 8 Am. the land bore N.W. by W. by Compass 40 mi. Do. by estimation Chron about Right

Wednesday May 7th. Fresh breezes from N.E. W. and Snow falling one half of the time or more at 3 P.M. spoke an Hobart Town Whaler. Latter part lowered for a Whale Steering on Different tacks by the wind under easy Sail. Lat. by obs. 54-06 N. Long. by acc. 169-20 E.

Thursday May 8th. Moderate winds from N. Steering on Different tacks by the wind, lowered twice for right Whales found them very shy could not get fast, the weather Cloudy and freezing Cold with some flurries of Snow. At 8 Am. Copper Island bore N.W. by W. 20 mi. Distance high land and completely dressed with Snow from top to toe.

Friday May 9th. Moderate Winds from N.E. W. to N.E. E. Steering on different tacks by the wind but mostly to the Eastward, under all Sail through the Day and short sail through the Night saw a Whale and lowered the Boats, thick weather and a considerable fall of Snow through the Day. Lat. by obs. S.R. 54-40 N. Long. by — " " 169-20 E.

Saturday May 10th. Winds from the Northward, first part thick Snow storm, Latter part Clear saw 3 Right Whales and lowered 3 times through the Day. Steering on Different tacks by the wind, Copper Bhering's Island in sight of Deck at 8 Am. bearing about W. by N. Lat. by obs. 54-39 N. Long. by Chron. 169-00 E.

Sunday May 11th. Moderate Winds from N.E. W. to N.E. E. Steering on Different tacks by the wind Middle part a considerable of Snow fell, saw one Right Whale and lowered out not get fast. Lat. by obs. 54-57 N. Long. by Chron. 169-16 E.

Monday May 12th. Moderate winds from N.E. W. to N.E. E. at 1 P.M. spoke the Bark Letherland of Hobart-Town 60 bbls. Sps. and a Right Whale alongside, Steering on Different tacks by the wind under all Sail trying to get to the Northward saw no Whales but often have flurries of Snow. Latter part put out the Bow Boat. Lat. by acc. 55-25 N. Long. 169-34 East from Greenwich
