

Sunday June 29th. first part light winds from the S. Steering on Diff. Courses to the Northward at 8 P.M. up to the Sea Middle part winds from S. S. W. Steering to the S. E. by the wind latter part Calm Lat. by obs. 64-05 N. Long. by Chron 177-00 W.

Monday June 30th. Comm. with moderate winds from S. Steering to the Westward latter part saw 2 or 3 Whales and lowered the Boats without success saw several Ships 2 a boiling Lat. by obs. 64-08 N. spoke Ship Coral 2 W this Sea. Long. by Chron 179-00 W.

Tuesday July 1st. Comm. with fresh breezes from the S. at 2 P.M. lowered for Whales, at 5 So. took one to the Ship, at 8 7 Commenced cutting, at 4 Am. finished stowing winds and very rugged latter part employed in clearing away the head &c. &c. Lat. by acc. 64-21 N. Long. - 178-30 W.

Wednes. July 2nd. Strong Gales from S. and thick weather the most of the time under a Double reefed Main S. Sail and Sail employed in boiling and Scapain Bone &c. &c.

Thursday July 3rd. Strong Winds from S. S. E. and thick weather heading on Diff. tacks under Short Sail employed in boiling &c. &c.

Friday July 4th. first part moderate winds from the Northward at 6 P.M. the fog lighted saw the Land bearing S. E. by S. by Compass. 30 mi. S. by Estimation at 4 Am. finished boiling latter part Winds from N. and sailing employed in stowing down oil

Saturday July 5th. First part fresh breezes from the Northward and Raining employed in stowing down oil, at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship Haulson of S. B. 1st Wh. this Sea. Steering on Diff. Courses to the Southward saw 1 Ship boiling Lat. by obs. 63-43 N. Long. by Chron. 178-00 W.

Sunday July 6th. First and Middle part fresh breezes from S. W. Steering on diff. tacks, latter part moderate winds from S. E. Steering to the Eastward saw several whales and lowered could not get near them with the Boats. Lat. by obs. 63-45 N. South. Long. - 178-00 W. by Acc.

Monday July 7th. All these 24 hours light variable Winds and Calms latter part saw several Ships to the S. E. & Whales Lat. by obs. 63-56 N. Long. by Chron 178-35 W.

Tuesday July 8th. First part moderate Winds from S. W. and fair at 4 P.M. spoke Ship Ontario of Sag Harbor Capt. Brown 1 Whale this Season also spoke Bark Roanoke of Greenport 1st Wh. Middle and latter part saw 3 Whales and lowered the Boats could not get near them latter part Raining - No obs. Lat. by acc. 64-00 N. Long. 178-00 W.

Wednesday July 9th. first part moderate Winds from the S. W. Steering to the Northward by the wind at 2 P.M. saw a W. and lowered the Boats, Middle part Calm, latter part winds from the Eastward Steering S. S. W. by Compass thick weather ends the Day No obs.

Thursday July 10th. Comm. with fresh breezes from S. E. Steering S. S. W. at 5 P.M. the fog lighted up saw the Land bearing S. E. by E. by Compass 27 So. the Sea very near ahead tacked Ship and Steered S. by S. by the wind at 7 Am. lowered for a Whale went alongside of him the Boatstaver missed him with the first Iron and bayhooked him with the second, took out some line and the Iron fell out, bad work, a first rate chance missed. latter part Steering on Diff. tacks thick and raining No obs. Lat. by Acc. 64-15 N. Long. 175-40 West.

Friday July 11th. Comm. with strong Gales from S. E. and Raining, at 2 P.M. Double reefed the Topsails took in the Jib and Main Sail Steering on Diff. tacks by the wind, latter part light winds and thick fog No obs. Lat. and Long. nearly the same
