

Saturday July 12th. First and Middle part light Winds from S. to S.E. and thick fog. most of the time at 5 P.M. saw a Whale and lowered the Boats, saw him no more. Latter part light air and Calms at Noon & Sail in sight from Mast head. Lat. by obs. $64^{\circ}04'N$. the nearest Land bearing S. S.E. by Compass 25 mi. Dis. by Estimation

Sund. July 13th light air from the S. & Calms and thick fog. the most of the time at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Chariot of Warren 1st. Steering to the North westward. Latter part sailed through some drift ice S.E. obs.

Monday July 14 Moderate Winds from the S. and a swell from the S.W. and thick weather spoke the John & Elizabeth one W. this Season also Ship Washington of Sag. Harbor 700 bbls. & Bark Roanoke 1 W. Steering on Siff. took under easy Sail S.E. obs. saw the ice to the S. near the land

Tuesday July 15th. fresh breezes from S. and foggy Steering on Siff. took under easy Sail at 10 Am. saw 2 Ships to Anchor to the S. 1 mi. Dis. the fog lighted up ^{some} saw the Land bearing from S. S.E. by Compass 8 mi. Dis. by Estimation made all Sail and Steered to the W. S. 20. by the wind a heavy swell rolling on the land.

Wednesday July 16th. light winds from S. to S.E. and thick weather first and Middle part Rainy heading to the Southward under Short Sail at 2 P.M. spoke the Ship St. George of S. B. 750 bbls. (300^g) S.E. obs.

Thursday July 17th. light Winds E. and Calms with thick weather and thick fog the most of the time spoke the Ship Moxa of S. B. 60 bbls. of Sp. and one W. this season at 11 Am. the weather lighted some 3 or 4 Sail in sight. Lat. by obs. $63^{\circ}27'N$.

Friday July 18th. First part light Winds from S.W. Steered S. by E. by Compass at 4 P.M. saw the land bearing S. S.E. 35 mi. Dis. by Estimation Middle and latter part thick weather spoke the India ship. at noon Lat. $64^{\circ}00'N$. the nearest Land bearing S.E. by E.

Saturday July 19th. First part fresh breezes from the S. and thick Weather spoke the Canton Packet of S. B. 1st this Sea. at 8 P.M. Double Reefed the Topsails and took in the Main Sail, strong Gales thick & Rainy. Latter part Rainy and thick fog the most of the time but left wind, heading to the Westward most of the time heavy swell from S.W. 20 and in Co. with several Sail -

Sunday July 20th. All these 24 hours moderate fresh breezes from the E. and thick weather with Rain Steering on Siff. took under easy Sail in Co. with several Sail -

Sunday July 20th. E. Long. Account moderate Winds from E. to S.E. and thick weather with small Rain Steering on Siff. took under Short Sail spoke the Ship Mt. Montpelier nothing this season

Monday July 21st. Light winds from the Eastward and Calms & thick fog. heading on Siff. took under Short Sail spoke the Mt. Wollaston 1 W. this Season

Tuesday July 22nd. Light Winds from S. E. to S. and thick weather most of the time at 8 P.M. the fog lighted saw the land bearing S.W. by Compass. Latter part bent a new Fore & Sail at 10 Am. Discovered S. in sight of Siff bearing S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. by Compass several Ships in sight saw the land to Westward through the fog at times at noon off St. Lawrence Bay -

Wednesday July 23rd. Bomm. with light from the S. at 4 P.M. spoke the John Wells nothing this Season also Ship Caravan 1 W. this Season Steered to the Southward at 2 P.M. strong Winds took in the light Sails at 7 Am came to Anchor in 23 fathoms Rocky Bottom E. Cape bear. S. 2 mi. Dis. the natives came on board in large numbers and appeared very friendly

Thursday July 24th. Strong Winds from S. E. about 20 Ships to Anchor, I went on shore the natives were very friendly
