

Saturday Aug. 16th. First part Clear spoke Ship's Mides of New-Bedford 1/2 W. this Season, Metacorn 800 W. 400 Sp. at 7 P.M. saw a Bowhead and lowered the Boats without success. E. Cape bearing S. E. by Compass 25 mi. Dis Middle & latter part thick fog moderate winds from N. W. heading on Diff. tacks under easy Sail

Sunday Aug. 17th. First part moderate winds from N. and thick weather lying with the head yards aback, at 7 P.M. spoke Ship's Simon of Sag Harbor 2 W. this Season Caroline of New-Bedford 2 Do. and Metacorn 800 W. 400 Sp. at 10 Steered S. fresh breezes and Clear at 4 Am. saw several Bowheads and lowered the Boats, at 7 Boats returned without success, latter part Strong Gale from N. W. and thick weather under Double reefed Topsails & Spencers apparently cutting all her Topsails closed up so ends at Noon hauled the Fore Topsail.

Monday Aug. 18th. Strong Gale from N. N. W. and thick weather the most of the time Steering on Diff. Courses under easy Sail latter part spoke Ship Copia at 1 Am. saw a Bowhead Lat. by obs. 66-33 N. several seen in sight

Tuesday Aug. 19th. Strong Gale from N. W. and thick weather about 1/2 of the time saw a number of Whales at 3 P.M. struck a Bowhead and the Irons Drove in less than 10 mi. the Pegal Iron having a hard wood pin instead of a soft pine one as I ordered it came out without breaking the pin - this was in fault of Boat-saver Knapp's in not doing as I told him, on the second saw one Ship Cutting & one Bailing several more Chasing Whales Middle part blew a heavy Gale under 2 Double reefed Topsails, Courses in 50 obs. to be relied on Lat. about 66-40 N. Long. about 170 W.

Wednes. Aug. 20th. First part Strong Gale from N. W. saw several Bowheads Middle part Calm, latter part moderate Winds from S. E. at 6 Am. saw Ship Copia ~~take~~ a Dead Whale several Ships bailing, lowered for Whales several times caught none E. Cape bearing S. E. by Compass 40 mi. Dis. by Estimation.

Thursday Aug. 21st. First part strong Winds from S. W. lowered once for Whales Middle and latter part light Winds from N. Steering S. thick weather most of the time saw one Bowhead 80 obs.

Friday Aug. 22nd. first part light winds from the Southward Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at 6 P.M. spoke Ship's Samuel Robertson & Eric of Fair-Haven Middle and latter part strong Winds from N. N. W. Steering on Diff. tacks at 10 Am. lowered for Whales saw quite a number of Bowheads and several Ships in sight all Manuevering or chasing Whales No obs.

Saturday Aug. 23rd. All these 24 hours strong Winds from N. N. W. Steering on Diff. tacks latter part saw Bark & several Bowheads and lowered once found it to be rigged for the Boats, under Double reefed Topsails and Spencers most of the time with thick weather

Sunday Aug. 24 Strong Winds from N. N. W. to N. under Double reefs most of the time at 4 P.M. spoke Ship Eric latter part saw Bark London Canton Packet Cutting, a Whale ^{also} saw a Ship Bailing at Noon E. Cape in sight bearing S. 1/2 E. by Compass Lat. by obs. 66-33 N.

Monday Aug. 25th. All these 24 hours strong Gale from the N. Steering on Diff. tacks by the wind under Double reefed Topsails at 3 P.M. spoke Ship Manuvria of N. B. 2 W. this Season, at Noon Lat. by obs. 67-00 N. Long. by Chron. 169-15 West.

Tuesday Aug. 26th. Strong Winds from N. N. W. to N. N. E. Steering on Diff. tacks mostly to the North Westward under Double reefs at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Moxia latter part thick and rainy N. obs. Lat. by S. R. 67-30 N. Long. by Do. 171-20 W.

Wednesday Aug. 27th. Strong Winds from N. N. E. to N. W. Steering on Diff. tacks by the wind under Double reefed Topsails thick weather nearly all the time, spoke Bark Cassack so ends in Co. with the Moxia No obs. Lat. by S. R. 67-48 N. Long. by Do. 168-47
