

Tuesday Sept. 9th. First part moderate winds from the Southward and fine weather saw Ship Moses take a Whale latter part fresh breezes saw a number of Whales and lowered the Boats without success saw Ship Galio to Anchor bying by a sunken Whale which would fill her shortly after saw her cutting

Lat. by obs. 68-59 N. Long. by Acc. 172 West.

Wednesday Sept. 10th. First part fresh breezes from S. E. at 4 P.M. took a Whale to the Ship, at 1/2 past 5 P.M. commenced cutting at Midnight finished. Latter part strong Gales from S. heading to the W. under a close reefed Main Topsail employed in stowing down oil Lat. by obs. 69-58 N. Long. about the same

Thursday Sept. 11th. First part strong Gales from S. and thick weather latter part moderate winds from the Northward and calm lowered for Whales but found them very shy could not strike 4 Ships in sight all boiling, so ends boiling and chasing Whales Lat. by obs. 69-20 N. Long. by Acc. about 172 W.

Friday Sept. 12th. First and Middle part light winds from the Southward latter part strong Gales from S. W. and rainy employed in boiling and stowing down oil, at 8 o'clock cooled down the works and took in the Fore Sail in consequence of bad weather. No obs. Canton Packet in sight boiling

Saturday Sept. 13th. First part ~~moderate~~ strong Winds from the N. W. lying under a close reefed Main Topsail and Spencer's latter part moderate winds from W. employed in boiling and chasing Whales spoke the Bark Canton Packet 5th this season at Noon our Boats, set to a Whale No. obs.

Sunday Sept. 14th. at 4 P.M. took a Whale to the Ship at 2 Am. finished cutting strong Gales from S. W. latter part. Employed in stowing down oil &c. Main Topsail in Lat. by obs. 68-51 N. Long. by Chrs. 170-12 W.

Monday Sept. 15th. First part strong Gales from S. W. Middle and latter part moderate spoke Ship Ontario of S. E. 2200 Tons 832 or 5108 Sp. same time spoke Bark Canton Packet 5th this season Lat. by obs. 68-40 North. Employed in boiling - Long. by Chrs. 171-25 West.

Tuesday Sept. 16th. Commenced with strong Gales from S. heading to the W. at 7 P.M. close reefed the Main S. at Midnight heeled up the weather Clew of the Fore Sail at 8 Am. blowing a heavy Gale cooled down the works got as snug as possible by running before the wind then furled the Fore Sail here to heading to the E. S. E. No. obs.

Wednesday Sept. 17th. All these 24 hours strong Gales from S. heading to the E. S. E. under a close reefed Main Topsail and Spencer's No obs.

Thursday Sept. 18th. Commenced with strong Gales from the S. heading to the W. at 1 P.M. started the works and comm. stowing down oil and Bone, at 3 P.M. the wind shifted to the E. S. E. and blew a heavy Gale cooled down the works again, heading to the S. E. turned up the lee Boats and goose winged the Main Topsail heavy Gales through the night latter part more moderate at 7 Am. set the Fore Spencer and went to boiling spoke Ship Abram Barker 13th W. so ends 5 Ships in sight one a boiling Lat. by obs. 68-57 N. Long. by Chrs. 172-16 W.

Friday Sept. 19th. Strong Winds from S. E. first part employed in boiling latter part in stowing down oil Spoke Ship Covinan 18th this season Lat. by obs. 69-19. Long. about. 172-00 W.

Saturday Sept. 20th. First part strong winds from S. E. latter part moderate saw several Whales and lowered the Boats but could not strike them 2 Ships and 1 Bark in sight one a boiling and all a Whaling. No obs. Lat. by Acc. 69-40 N. Long. about 171-16 W.
