

Thursday June 3rd. Light winds and variables, Steering on
Diff. Courses to the Eastward Lat. by obs. 58-43⁵⁴ Long. by Chron. 174-22⁰

Friday June 4th. Light variable winds and Calms
Lat. by obs. 58-59⁵⁴ Long. by Chron. 174-25 East.

Saturday June 5th. Fresh breezes from S.W. Steering
N. at 8 Am. Double reefed the Topsails, at 9 Do. spoke the
French Ship Orion Clean. Latter part thick weather
At 8 o'clock alongside the Ice Lat. by obs. 60-52⁵⁴ Long. 175-20⁰

Sunday June 6th. Fresh breezes from the S. and thick
weather Steering on Diff. tacks by the wind under Double
Reefs. Latter part saw 3 Polar Whales along the Ice landed
one, and broke off the head of the lance 500 lbs.

Monday June 7th. First part saw quite a number
of Polar whales in the Ice sent in the Boats struck
three 1 line parted, 1 Iron broke, and cut one line
to save it as the Whale run into the heavy Ice
where a Whale Boat could not get, Latter part
saw several Whales but could not get fast.
at 8 o'clock land in sight although somewhat cloudy
bearing from N. to W. S.W. by Estimation 40 or 50 mi
Dis. Land 3 Ships in sight Lat. by obs 61-06⁵⁴

Tuesday June 8th. Moderate Winds from S. E.
and thick fog most of the time saw several Whales
and lowered the Boats without success 8 o'clock.

Wednesday June 9th. Commences with thick fog at 4 P.M.
Spoke the Ship Gustave of Harrow Clean at 8 Do. struck
a Whale sounded heavy and parted the line went
of Spouting Blood Lat. by obs. 61-28⁵⁴ Long 175-30 E.
Land to the N.W. 30 mi. Dis

Thursday June 10th. at 3 P.M. struck a Whale at
5 Do. took him to the Ship and commenced cutting
at Midnight finished raining, Latter part fine
weather and Calm, at 8 Am. commenced boiling at
Noon cooled down the works in consequence of the
Boats striking the Whale very poor and Watered 6 Ships in
sight one a being the nearest Land N.W. 25 mi. Dis Lat. 61-28⁵⁴

Friday June 11th. begins with moderate Winds from the
Southward Steering on Diff. Courses to the Northward at 10
Am. Commenced boiling at Noon spoke the Ship Navigator
of Fairhaven nothing this season Lat. by obs. 62-06⁵⁴ Land 20 mi
Dis

Saturday June 12th. first part spoke the Ship Majestic 2 Whales
Ship Navigator nothing this season. Canada Nothing this season. Gratified
10th. moderate Winds from the S. Latter part strong Winds
and rainy at 8 Am. Cooled down the Works heavy Ice in sight
to the S.E. 2 mi. Dis. under a Double reefed Main Topsail and
Fore Sail, thick weather ends the day, on Diff. tacks took Ships
Harcourt, 2nd this season & Bartholomew Coasted 17th

Sunday June 13th. Moderate Winds from the Southward and
foggy most of the time, at 6 P.M. spoke Ships, Midas 1st L. Chuk-
mond nothing this season Latter part employed in stowing down
oil at Noon off Archangel bay Cape Harrow 2 or 3 mi. Dis about
14 Ships in sight several Manoeuvring.

Through mistake I have left out Saturday June 13th. there
was fresh breezes from the Southward and thick weather with
considerable Rain under short Sail, employed in boiling

Tuesday June 15th. First and Middle part light variable
Winds and thick weather with rain Latter part fair saw a
great number of Polar Whales struck one and parted the line
Cape Rad. to the W. 15 mi: Dis saw several Ships take Whales

Wednesday June 16th. first part struck 4 Whales drawn from
from three at 9 P.M. took one to the Ship, at 1 Am. commenced
cutting, at 6 finished at 7 Do. took another Whale at Noon finished
cutting him in Lat. by obs. 62-51⁵⁴ Land 25 mi. Dis

Thursday June 17th. First part light winds and pleasant
at 5 P.M. Double reefed the Topsails, Middle & Latter part fresh
breezes and foggy most of the time at 9 Am. struck a Whale
and sunk him at Noon fast to another Whale spouting
blood.

Friday June 18th. at 2 P.M. took the W. to the Ship at 9 finish-
ed cutting him in, at 11 commenced boiling, at 6 Am. found one of
the pots to be cracked cooled down and took it out of the Works, at
Noon commenced setting another Lat. by obs. 63-13⁵⁴
