

Wednes. 6th. Begins with heavy Gales from S. S. W. to S. W.  
heading to the Southward under all possible sail frequently  
sounding in 20 fathoms of water at 8 P.M. began to deepen the  
water to 26 fathoms, at Midnight the wind shifted to W. and  
moderated at 4 Am. wore ship latter part variable winds from  
W. to S. W. and equally steering on different courses to the  
South westward the weather quite smoky, cant see but a  
short distance, at 11 spoke the bark Jupiter of Boston  
from Nobeal for Boston Lat. by obs. 40-46 N.  
Long. by Chron. 70-00 W.

Thurs. April 7th. Commences with strong Winds from S. W.  
and smoky steering N. W. by N. and N. N. W. at 8 P.M. nearly  
Calam, at 8 So. made Gayhead light bearing N. E. by E. 10 mi. Dis.  
by estimation at 10 fresh breezes from N. W. at 10 Am. I  
left the bark some 300. 4 mi. below the light in a New Bedford  
boat at Noon I arrived on the wharf at New Bedford the bark  
beating up so ends my voyage in the Arab
