First part moderate breeze from S. E. with pleasant weather ship steering course W. N. E. under all sail. Middle part wind cut. Latter part wind from N. E. ship by the wind heading to the N. N. W. crew employed in working in the rigging

Wednesday Feb 17th

First part light air from north with pleasant weather ship by the wind heading to the north. Middle part moderate breeze from N. N. E. ship heading N. W. latter part fresh breeze and rugged at daylight tack ship to the Eastward at 10 o'clock took in the royals crew employed in working on the rigging. Set two sails

Lat 25° 10' S.

Long 88° 25' W.

Steering to the North 1869

Thursday Feb 18th

First part strong winds from N. N. E. with clear weather and rugged ship by the wind heading to the East middle and latter part the same crew employed in working on the rigging

Lat. 24° 36' S.

Long 86° 00' W.

Friday Feb 19th

First part blowing heavy with rugged sea ship by the wind heading to the Eastward wind from North middle and latter part the same crew employed in working on the rigging

Lat 23° 43' S.

Long 84° 02' W.
