Sunday March 13th First part light breeze from N.W. with pleasant weather ship steering course E.N.E. at sundown took in sail Middle and latter part wind and weather the same
Lat. 33° 48' S.
Long 179° 13' E

Monday March 14th First part light breeze from west with pleasant weather ship steering course N.E. at sundown took in sail Middle and latter part light air from north ship by the wind heading to the Eastward crew employed in different jobs about the ship painted the wheel and sail four sails
Lat. 33° 53' S.
Long 180° 00'

Tuesday March 15th First part light air from north with pleasant weather ship by the wind heading to the Eastward at sundown took in sail Middle and latter part moderate breeze from the Southward ship steering off different courses looking for whales crew employed in different jobs about the ship sail two sails
Lat. 33° 15' S.
Long 179° 38' E

Wednesday March 16th Fresh breeze from the Southward with pleasant weather ship steering off different courses spoke the Bark Tamaland at sundown took in sail and luffed to the wind Middle and latter part strong wind from S.E. with ragged sea ship steering various courses sail two sails
Lat. 32° 52' S.
Long 179° 48' E

Thursday March 17th First part Strong winds from S.E. with squally weather and ragged at sundown took in sail and luffed to the wind heading to the N.E. Middle and latter part wind and weather the same at 3 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. sail asail
Lat. 32° 15' S.
Long 179° 46' E

Friday March 18th First part Strong winds from S.E. with ragged weather at dark wore ship to the N.E. and took in sail Middle and latter part wind the same with squally weather at 3 P.M. wore ship to the South
Lat. 32° 30' S.

Saturday March 19th First part Strong breeze from S.E. with squally weather and ragged ship by the wind heading to the South under double reef topsails Middle and latter part weather the same sail two sails at 3 P.M. wore ship to the N.E.
Lat. 33° 03' S.
Long 179° 53' E

Sunday March 20th First part fresh breeze from S.E. with clear weather ship by the wind heading to the N.E. under double reef topsails Middle and latter part more moderate ship by the wind on opposite tack
Lat. 32° 23' S.
Long 179° 30' E
