Sunday May 29th

First part fresh breeze from Southward with squally rugged weather ship steering to the north at sundown took in sail and luffed to the wind heading off shore. Middle and latter part light gale from South at daylight were ship to the Eastward. Said two sails at Meridian. Milford Haven bore East 10 miles distant.

Monday May 30th

First part strong winds from South clear weather ship heading to the Eastward under easy sail at sundown luffed to the wind heading to the west. Middle and latter part wind the same at daylight steered off to the north at Meridian. Cascade point bore East 10 miles distant. Said sail asail.

Tuesday May 31st

First part strong winds from the Southward with clear weather at 1 P.M. luffed to heading to the west at sundown took in sail. Middle and latter part moderate breeze from S.W. with fair weather at daylight were ship off the Cascade point bore S.E. 10 miles distant.

Wednesday June 1st

First part fresh breeze from west with fair weather ship to the wind heading to the N.W. under topsails at sundown took in sail. Middle and latter part weather the same at midnight were ship to the South. Said asail.

Thursday June 2nd

Commenced with moderate breeze from N.W. with hazy weather ship steering S.W. under topsails at sundown took in sail and luffed to the wind. Middle and latter part fresh breeze with hazy weather at daylight steered S.W. under easy sail. Said asail. No Obs.

Friday June 3rd

Commenced with fresh breeze from N.W. with hazy weather ship steering S.W. at 1 P.M. commenced to rain and at 4 took in sail and luffed to the wind heading to the westward. Middle part wind from South with clear weather ship heading to the west. Latter part wind from N.E. with thick weather at daylight were ship to the East. Said the land and the sail.

Saturday June 4th

First part fresh breeze from N.E. with thick varying weather ship to the South heading to the Eastward at sundown took in sail and when ship to the westward land bearing E.S.E. 5 miles distant. Middle and latter part heavy gale from N.E. with thick weather ship bore to heading to the N.W. under close reef main topsail at 1 P.M. turned the lee boats up. No Obs.

Sunday June 5th

Commenced with heavy gale from N.E. with thick weather and heavy sea running. Said at topsail. Schooner steering to the South. Middle and latter part more moderate with cloudy weather took in broad board on deck to mend but were at got there on the crains. No Obs.
