Wednesday June 22nd

First part moderate breeze from west with clear weather ship by the wind heading to the north at 1 P.M. laid black fish toward shore but with out success at Sundown took in sail. Middle part light variable wind latter part moderate breeze from N.E. with cloudy weather ship by the wind heading to the N.W. got out new gill and spunk and sent them at Meridian. Milford Haven bore East 25 miles dist

Thursday June 23rd

First part moderate breeze from N.E. with cloudy weather ship by the wind heading to the N.W. at Sundown took in sail and checked ship to the Eastward. Middle and latter part light breeze from S.E. at Meridian Milford Haven bore S.E. 31 miles dist took in bundles brooks and took head back out of the Haber room and stowed the in the fore peak

Friday June 24th

First part fresh breeze from East with rainy weather at 2 P.M. took in all sail but storm sails at dark were ship to the South. Middle the same latter part fresh gale with heavy rain. no Obs.

Saturday June 25th

Commenced with fresh gale from north with heavy rain ship have to heading to the East at dark took up the heads and were ship to the west. Middle part the same latter part the wind hauled to the west with clear weather said the land Milford Haven bore E.N.E. 20 miles dist

Sunday June 26th

First part light breeze from S.W. with clear weather ship heading to the north at Sundown took in sail. Middle and latter part calm with rainy weather at Meridian Milford Haven bore E.N.E. 25 miles dist

Monday June 27th

First part light air and calm with clear weather. Middle part fresh breeze and squally latter part light gale at daylight. Steered off to the North at Meridian. Luffed at the wind heading off shore at Milford Haven bore E.S.E. 20 miles dist

Tuesday June 28th

First part fresh gale from South with squally weather ship have to heading to the westward under storm sails. Middle part same moderate latter part fresh breeze from S.W. with fog squalls. Ship heading to the Eastward at Meridian Cascade point bore N.E. 15 miles dist

Wednesday June 29th

First part light variable winds with clear weather ship by the wind heading to the westward at Sundown took in sail. Middle and latter part fresh gale from N.E. with heavy rain at daylight. Steered W. by S. and S.W. the fore top sail doubt the reefed rolled the larboard board under and stowed it at Meridian the with hauled to the north with rain squalls at 10 P.M. the courses, no Obs.
