Saturday July 9th First part light gale from S.W. with squally weather ship by the wind heading to the Westward Middle and latter part fresh breeze with pleasant weather ship by the wind heading to the N.W. under all sail crew employed in different jobs about the ship
Lat. 34° 44' S.
Long 159° 00' E.

Sunday July 10th First part fine breeze from the South with pleasant weather ship by the wind heading to the West under all sail Middle and latter part the same
Lat. 34° 42' S.
Long 158° 33' E.

Monday July 11th First part fine breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather ship steering S.W. by W. under all sail Middle and latter part light gale from N.E. ship steering N.N.W. at daylight sent down the fore topsail to repair it
Lat. 35° 10' S.
Long 158° 26' E.

Tuesday July 12th First part calm with clear weather Middle part the same latter part light breeze from South ship steering W. by S. sent up the fore topsail and bent it and sent down the main topsail to repair
Lat. 35° 16' S.
Long 158° 55' E.

Wednesday July 13th Commences with light breeze from South with pleasant weather ship steering W. by S. Middle and latter part fresh breeze from S.E. crew employed repairing the main topsail
Lat. 35° 00' S.
Long 158° 07' E.

Steering to the Westward 1870

Thursday July 14th First part fresh breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather ship steering W. by S. sent the main topsail and sent down the fore sail at sundown took in sail for the night Middle and latter part wind and weather the same took out and set fore sail and bent it at 11 A.M. sight the land bearing west
Lat. 35° 16' S.
Long 151° 43' E.

Friday July 15th First part fresh breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather ship steering W. by S. at sundown took in sail and clipped to the wind heading to the North West Middle and latter part wind and weather the same ship steering different courses sent fore sail and land
Lat. 35° 03' S.

Saturday July 16th First part fresh breeze from N.E. with squally weather ship steering Courses at sundown took in sail Middle and latter part wind from East ship by the wind heading N.N.E. saw the land
Lat. 34° 51' S.

Sunday July 17th First part fresh breeze from East with squally weather ship by the wind heading to the N.N.E. at sundown took in sail Middle and latter part wind and weather the same at 9 P.M. was ship to the South

Monday July 18th Commences with fresh breeze from East with cloudy weather ship by the wind heading to the South under easy sail latter part wind from north with pleasant weather saw the land without the flying jib
Lat. 35° 46' S.
Long 151° 51' E.
