Friday August 7th First part fresh gale from N.W. with haze weather ship hove to heading to the westward Middle and latter part the same. Saw ashore at 10 A.M. were ship to the north No. 10

Saturday Aug 8th Commences with strong winds from west with cloudy weather and heavy swell ship heading to the north Middle and latter part the same at. American New Stone saw N.W. 10 miles and saw ashore

Sunday Aug 9th Commences with fresh breeze from N.W. with pleasant weather ship on the South-west tack Middle and latter part the same at 9 A.M. were ship to the Northward saw ashore Lat. 41° 28' S.

Monday Aug 10th Commences with moderate breeze from N.W. with fair weather Middle and latter part a gale from west with squally weather ship hove to heading to the South-west Lat. 41° 28' S.

Tuesday Aug 11th First part moderate gale from west with squally weather at 11 P.M. were ship to the Northward Middle and latter part strong winds from South-west with squally weather at. American Lighted South-west Cape having N.W. Lat. 41° 21' S.

Wednesday August 9th First part strong winds from Southward with squally weather ship steering various course at Sundown took in sail Middle and latter part light variable air with cloudy weather at. American B. D. D. saw Lat. 25 miles and saw ashore

Thursday Aug 10th Commences with light air from N.W. with cloudy weather Middle part wind from South latter part wind from S.W. with fresh squally ship by the wind heading to the N.W. land and a sail in sight

Friday Aug 11th First part fresh breeze from N.W. with fog squally at 11 P.M. were ship to the westward at Sundown took in sail Middle and latter part the same ship on opposite tack saw the land and ashore Lat. 43° 11' S.

Saturday Aug 12th Commences with fresh breeze from N.W. with fog squally ship on opposite tack at Sundown took in sail Middle and latter part the same saw the land Lat. 43° 22' S.

Sunday Aug 13th First part strong winds from N.W. with squally weather ship by the wind heading to the South-west Middle and latter part fresh gale from N.W. at 10 P.M. were ship to the Northward No. 10
