Thursday Dec 12th

Commence with fresh gale from west with squally weather ship here to heading to the South Middle and latter part fresh gale from west to N.W.

Friday Dec 13th

Commence with fresh gale from west with squally weather ship here to heading to the South Middle and latter part the same

Lat 49° 13' S.
Long 167° 31' E.

Saturday Dec 14th

Commence with fresh gale from west with squally weather at 2 P.M. more ship to the north and set the main topsail close reefed Middle and latter part more moderate employed in getting new boots and repairing damage done by the gale. At 8 P.M. hauled over off duty Lat 48° 31' S. with occasional drizzle

Sunday Dec 15th

Commence with strong wind from N.W. with hazy weather ship by the wind heading to the north at 4 P.M. hauled ship to the South saw sail Middle and latter part fresh gale from N.W. with hazy weather ship here to heading to the N.W. at 8 A.M. took in the main topsail.

Monday Dec 18th

Commence with fresh gale from N.W. with thick weather ship here to heading to the N.W. Middle and latter part the same

Lat 49° 15' S.
Long 168° 11' E.

Tuesday Dec 19th

Commence with fresh gale from N.W. with hazy weather ship here to heading to the N.W. Middle and latter part more moderate at 1 P.M. more ship to the north and set the main topsail and fore sail

Lat 49° 01' S.
Long 168° 33' E.

Wednesday Dec 20th

Commence with strong breeze from N.W. with hazy weather ship by the wind heading to the north at 1 P.M. put out a boat to go on the starboard crane Middle and latter part the same ship on opposite tack no the

Thursday Dec 21st

Commence with moderate breeze from westward with drizzle weather ship by the wind heading to the N.W. Middle and latter part gale the same with clear weather ship by the wind on opposite tack at daylight signified on the land seen of Ulukoua Island at meridian ship North by the bow S.W. 8 miles and G. Bain went on duty
