fine weather at daylight got underway and went out side of the head and anchored sent up the mast for gallant gear and done other jobs about the ship George Bain went off duty with the venereal disease

Thursday Feb 13th

head wind with a rain storm ship waiting for fair weather

Friday Feb 14th

fresh breeze from west with clear weather at 6 A.M. sea account got underway and steered to sea moved the anchor and chains and made every thing snug for sea and got ready for the passage home
