Commence with
strong breeze from South with pleasant
weather ship steering N.E. by E. Breeze and
latter part moderate breeze from S.E. with
fine weather crew employed in fitting up
rigging
Lat. 25° 00' S.
Long 42° 15' W.

Wednesday April 23rd

Commence with light
breeze from East with pleasant weather
ship by the wind heading to the north
Breeze and latter part breeze from north
with ship by the wind heading to the East
crew employed in ratting down and
doing other jobs about the ship
Lat. 24° 15' S.
Long 41° 18' W.

Thursday April 24th

Commence
with moderate breeze from northward
ship by the wind heading to the East
Breeze and latter part wind from
S.W. ship steering course N.E. by E.
crew employed in ratting down
and doing other jobs about the ship
