Friday May 9th Commenced with
 light breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather
 ship steering North latter part calm
 finished stowing off the water between
 decks and doing other jobs in the hold
 Lat 3° 39' S

Saturday May 10th Commenced with
 calm with pleasant weather. Middle part
 the same. Latter part light breeze from west
 ship heading to the North crew employed
 in different jobs about the ship. Lat 3° 17' S

Sunday May 11th Commenced with light
 breeze from west with rain ship steering to
 the North. Middle and latter part light squally
 winds and calm with heavy rain showers
 carried away the head of the main. The old
