 Long 35° 10' W

Thursday May 18th Commenced with
 light breeze from N.E. with clear
 weather ship heading to the North West
 latter part fresh breeze and cloudy
 crew employed in taking down
 no off

to the North in the Atlantic Ocean
 Friday May 16th 1873 Commenced with
 fresh breeze from N.E. with fair weather
 ship by the wind heading to the N.W.
 midday and latter part the same crew
 employed in taking down and doing other
 job about the ship. Lat 3° 25' N
 Long 39° 11' W

Saturday May 17th Commenced with
 moderate breeze from N.E. with pleasant
 weather ship heading to the N.W. midday
 and latter part the same crew employed
 in taking down Lat 4° 48' N
 Long 42° 01' W

Sunday May 18th Commenced with
 fresh breeze from N.E. with pleasant
 weather ship steering course N.W. by N.
 midday and latter part the same
 Lat 8° 15' N
 Long 44° 25' W

Monday May 19th Commenced with
 strong wind from N.E. ship steering
 N.W. by N. midday and latter part
 the same crew employed in taking
 down and doing other job about the
 ship Lat 9° 51' N
 Long 46° 42' W
