Comes in fine at five AM came on board Whales went to Windward Middle part a fresh breeze from SW later part a strong gale & squally Ship under double reef Topsails Corser fished Ship heading to N+W

Sunday Sept 14th

Comes in with a fresh breeze from SW at ten AM Wind hauled to the N with a strong gale ^{with} rain later part more moderate Ship on different tack working to the E

Monday Sept 15th

Throught this day a fresh breeze from the N Ship on different tacks Saw a Barye & Schooner Berling at four AM passed a Whales Carver Crew employed making Spungarn

Tuesday Sept 16th

Throught this day fresh breezes from the N with rain squalls Ship on different tacks No observation Crew employed making Spungarn Broke out provisions from the after hold

Wednesday Sept 17th

First and middle part fresh breeze from the N with rain squalls Ship heading to the E later part light air from the S+W Crew employed making Spungarn

Thursday Sept 18th

Throught this day a fresh breeze from S+W and squally Ship heading to the N+W Saw several birds steering to the E Crew employed making Linet

Friday Sept 19th

First part a strong breeze and squally from the S+W middle and later part from the N a strong breeze with rain squalls Saw a whale my Schooner to leeward the ship on different tacks

Saturday Sept 20th

Throught this day a strong gale from N+E with a rugged sea Ship heading to the N+W

Sunday Sept 21

Throught this day a strong Gale from the N+E with a strong sea Ship heading to S+E

Monday Sept 22

Throught this day a strong Gale from NE Ship heading to S+W Crew employed making Spungarn No observation to day

Tuesday Sept 23

First part a fresh breeze from the N+NE middle light & later calm Ship on different tacks Crew employed making Spungarn
