Winds from the Westward with
rain squalls No observation to day

Sunday October 26
First part light winds
and squally Middle and later part
a fresh breeze from the S.W. Ship
heading S.E. all sail set to the best
advantage Lat 6-12

Monday October 27
Through this day
light baffling winds with heavy
rain squalls Lat 5-6
Lon 17-25

Tuesday October 28
Through this day
light airs and calms with rain
squalls Lat 4-45

Wednesday October 29
First and middle
part Calm later part a light
air from the S.E. with slight
rain squalls At one o'clock
for Black fish Leeward Waist & Bow
Boat struck Saved two
No observation to day

South in the Atlantic 1873

Thursday October 30
Through this day light
baffling winds with rain squalls
Crew employed making line &
Reeled the Blackfish they made, Lat 9-5
95 Gal Lon 17-25

Friday October 31st
First part light baffling
Winds Middle and later part a fresh
breeze from S.E. with heavy rain squalls
Lat 3-6
Lon 15-2

Saturday November 1st
First part a fresh breeze
from the S. Ship heading from S.W. to S.
Middle part light later part fresh
Crew employed at General Ship's duty
Lat 2-45
Lon 15-58

Sunday November 2
This day light breeze from
South to S.W. and clear weather Ship
heading from W.S.W. to N.W.W.
Crew employed making line &
Lat 1-45
Lon 21-18

Monday November 3
Fine weather from
the S.E. with a fresh breeze Ship
heading S.W. Crew employed making
line Bent the four staysail &
Lat 0-7.5
Lon 22-10

Tuesday November 4
Fine weather & a strong
breeze from the S.E. Ship heading S.W.
Employed painting the Leeward and
Waist Boat Crossed the Meridian
Lat 1-58.5
Lon 23-18
