from the NE Ship heading S+E

Lon 41-00

Thursday December 29
Throught this day fine
clear weather from the N with a
light breeze steering to S+E.
later part Employed breaking
out provisions
Lat 43-55
Lon 42-30

Friday December 30
Throught this day
fine weather from the S
Ship heading to S+E Carrying all
Sail
Lat 45-16
Lon 46-12

Passage Across the Indian Ocean 1873

Wednesday Decem 31
First and middle
part fine weather from the N
later part thick fog took in the
light sails double reefed the topsails
more Ship heading to the N+W
No observation this day

Thursday January 1st 1874
Comes in with a
thick fog and a light breeze from
the N at Eleven AM wind hauled
to the W Middle and later part
thick fog and a light breeze from
the W Ship under Short Sail
Lat 48-18
Lon 48-28

Friday January 2
Comes in with
a thick fog from the SW Ship
heading to the N+W under
Short sail Middle part variable
at six PM made Sail and
cleared to the E a fresh breeze
from the W at Eleven AM rose
the land and cleared sail -
Lat 48-57
Lon 48-58

Saturday January 3
Comes in with a fresh
breeze from the N+W Ship heading
to the land at six AM passed
Penguin Island Middle and later
part of this day thick fog and raising
a fresh breeze from the N no
observation
