Sunday, January 9th First part strong
breeze and squally from the S W
Middle & later part from
the S W with rain
no observations

Saturday, January 10th Throught this day
a strong gale from the S W
Ship heading to the E
Lat 43-27
Long 85-35

Sunday, January 11th Throught this day
a strong gale and squally
from the S W Ship heading E
Lat 43-21
Long 85-52

Monday, January 12th Comes in with a
heavy Gale from the S W
the light sails at eight AM
were reefed the Main topsail
and brought the ship to on the
port tack heading W N W
Middle part the same This day
ends with a heavy Gale split the
Main topsail & faked it no obser-
vations

Tuesday, January 13th Comes in with a heavy
gale from the S W Middle part more
moderate later part a fresh breeze
with a heavy sea at 24 PM Heaved off
to the E Bent Main topsail & flying jib
