Tuesday April 24
Comes in with a strong gale from the N.E. with Rain Ship heading N.W. the gale increasing till the Ship on the port tack heading ESE under a fore reef Rain topail Middle part more moderate with heavy thunder and lightning with Rain later part a fresh breeze from E made sail and cleared S.W.

Friday April 27
Throught this day a strong breeze and smoky squally weather from the E Ship heading S at eleven P.M. rose the three knigs and sep. of steering W by N so ends this day.

Saturday May 1
Throught this day a strong gale and squally from ESE Ship heading from W by N to N.W. making a passage no observations this day.

Sunday May 2
Throught this day a strong gale from ENE with steady Rain Ship heading from N.W. to W under short sail R observation

Monday May 3
Throught this day a fresh gale and squally from the S.E. Ship heading W by N

Tuesday May 4
First part a strong breeze from the S.E. and cloudy Middle part heavy Rain squalls with light variable winds later part a light breeze & overcast Ship heading W.S.W.
