First part a strong breeze from the NW three boats of whaling, at three & took the whale along side by the heave to, took him & in to Port Wilson the head chane parted out two on his flukes and at five & h made sail with the whale along side cleared E by N the Rock bearing ENE dist 25 M at twelve midnight passed the Rock at three PM wind hauled to the NE light breeze at seven PM took in sail commenced to cut at this day ends with a light breeze and fine weather from the NE

Sunday, November 28

First part fine weather from the E at eight & finished cutting middle part fine ship lying aback later part fine clear weather from the SE crew employed cutting junk at eight & h started the works ship heading to the W with a light air

Monday, November 30

First part a light air from the SE & clear weather middle & later part a fresh breeze from the SE & N ship heading W at three PM passed the Rock to the S

Tuesday, Decem 1st

Thought this day fine light weather from the SE employed Porting Ben some oil in the ground in the star hole ship on different tacks Cruising the Rock bearing NNE dist 25

Wednesday, Decem 2

First part a fresh breeze from the N middle part light at five & finished Porting at seven PM commenced to flow down oil in the main hole this day ends with a light breeze from the NW the Rock bearing NNE dist 20 M

ones in with a strong gale from the NW employed flowing down ship on the Port tack heading to NE at seven & finished set flowing oil wind light with a heavy swell middle part a light breeze from the N ship heading NNE later part a fresh breeze from the S at nine PM passed the Rock to the N dist two miles this day ends with a fresh breeze and foggy ship heading NNE
