Monday, January 4
First part Wind failed
to the W a strong Gale over the
Ship. To under a close reef main
topsail. Middle part a strong Gale
with heavy squalls set a close
reef four topsail at nine A. M.
steared off to the E Solander Rock
bearing E. N. E. dist ten M at half past
ten A. M. passed the Rock with a
strong Gale and heavy squalls.

Tuesday, January 5
Comes in with a
strong Gale from the S. W. with
heavy squalls Ship steering to
the E bound to Port William
split main topsail & jib at 24 M
came to with the Port Anchor
at Port William Middle part a strong
breeze with heavy squalls at
tent a new main topsail and jib
at nine A. M. got under way and
beat farther up the harbor and
anchored this day ends the service

Wednesday, January 6
Comes in with
a heavy Gale from N. W. Middle
part the same later part
Wind increasing with heavy squalls
let go the second anchor
the crew employed backing out
water & took the Starboard Boat
in for repairs

Thursday, Jan 7
Comes in with a
terific Gale from the S. W.
Ship lying at anchor in port William
at three P. M. the Gale moderated
Middle and later part light variable
airs from W to E. Crew employed
repairing the main topsail
