

Bark Withde Scars Cruising

Monday February 8th

Ship lying in Port -
The Eliza Adams came in with
a whale in tow a strong gale
and squally from the W
At three PM set under way
with a light air from the W
and went to Sea Ends the same

Tuesday, February 9th

First part a fresh
breeze from the W ship heading
out of the Straits middle and
later part the same

Wednesday February 10th

First and middle
a light breeze from the W ship
working out of the Straits
later part a strong gale from
the SW at twelve the
Solander rock bore SW distant
eight NM close reefed the
foam and main topsail

Thursday February 11th

Came in with
a heavy gale from the SW set
the foresail and four topsail
the Rock bearing SW distant ten NM
at six PM more moderate
set the four topsail & four sail
Ship on the Harbor tack heading
W by N middle part heading S
wind from W by W later part
a fresh breeze from the SW ship
on the Port tack heading to SW
the Rock in sight

of Solander Rock 1875-

Friday February 12th

First part a fresh
breeze from the SW ship heading
to SW middle and later part
from the E and fine the Rock
in sight to the E

Saturday February 13th

First part a light
breeze and fine weather from
the E ship an distant tacks
Cruising Landed the Tamerlane
middle part wind hauled to
the SW later part a heavy
gale from the SW sailed the
main topsail ship on the Harbor
tack heading W by W turned
the Starboard and West Port up

Sunday February 14th

First part a heavy
gale from the SW ship lying
under storm sails the boats turned
up middle part more moderate
wind hauled to W later part
a light breeze and fine from the
SW ship heading to SW the
Rock in sight bearing NE distant
four NM the Tamerlane & Eliza Adams
in sight to leeward
