Thought this day light baffling. Winds from the S.W. Ship on different tacks working out of the Straits. Saw the Bark Camerlane going into the Straits.

Tuesday, March 2

Thought this day fine weather from the S.W. Ship on different tacks cruising. At eleven the post the Rock.

Wednesday, March 3

First and middle part fine weather from the W. Later part a fresh breeze and overcast from the N.E. Ship on the Harbor tack, beating S.W. the Rock in sight to the E.
