

Book Matilda Sears on a Passage To

Sunday October 4.

First part a fresh breeze from the SE ship on the port tack light sails furled Middle part strong ship on Starboard tack later part a strong Gale and overcast land in sight ship heading NW and double reef topsails

Monday October 5.

First part a strong breeze and overcast from the NE ship on different tacks Middle part ship bore to close reef main topsail heading SE thick and raining At Wilcox Cape cloud bore WNW last fifteen miles a light breeze from the S and a heavy mist from the N

Tuesday November

First part a light breeze from the SE ship on different tack Middle part a fresh breeze from the SE ship heading S later part a light air from NE the land in sight

Saturday To Ship New 1825

Wednesday November

Comes in with a strong Gale from N by E double reefed topsails steering NW Middle part the same later part a strong Gale from N ship heading S land in sight to the N

Lat 41-20

Thursday November

Thought this day a heavy Gale from N by E ship lying under close reef main topsail heading NW on the port tack

Lat 40-25

Long 13-25

Friday November 6.

First part a heavy Gale from the N ship lying under close reef main topsail Middle part more moderate wind hauled to the NW made sail heading NE later part a fresh breeze from NW ship on the Starboard tack heading N

Lat 38-15

Long 13-25

Saturday November 7.

Thought this day a fresh breeze from the N ship on the Starboard tack heading NW double reef topsails
