Comes in with a strong Gale from the S. at three have the ship to on the Starboard tack with main topsail furled. Middle part the same with Rain. Later part the same no observations. Turned up the Waist-Boat.

Friday Dec 3

Through-
a heavy Gale from the S. W. Ship on the Starboard tack heading to the S. W. the main topsail furled the Waist-Boat turned up.
