Tuesday, Decem^r 21

First part fine from
the S.W. at four P.M. rose sperm Whales
boarded three boats at seven P.M.
boat struck at nine took the whale
to the ship and got ready to cut
Middle part fine the Tamerlane
in sight with a whale along side
at half past two P.M. looked on
this day fine from the S.W. employed
cutting The Rock bearing NNE dist 12 16
