

Saturday July 28th Ship lying at anchor
or crew employed repairing sails
The velocities and number of boats
chasing whales the Commodore's
boats struck

Sunday July 29th Fine with a fresh
breeze from the S

Monday July 31st A strong breeze from
the SSE four boats of cruising
land several whales of shore
at three came on board
and filled the tank from
the main tale

Tuesday August 1st Continues a strong
gale from the SE hoisted four
boats for whales did not get
fast. So came on board
at eight - PM Land 2 Boats
Left up of the North end
of Long Island Landed it -
was a ship on the reef
the harbor and Bay Boat
went to sea what the matter
was found the British Gun Boat
Barraclough lying at anchor in
Long Island Passage foreing
Signal Guns and throwing up
rockets to advise coast and of
how being there stopped our
boats return and stayed all night.

Wednesday August 2nd At day light -
the Barraclough got under way
and steamed up to the
anchorage with the boats in
land a strong gale from the
SE the Commodore lost a boat
by damping a stern of the steam
er

Thursday August 3rd Thought this day
a strong gale and overcast -
from ESE let go the second
Anchor the Barraclough got at
Anchor

Friday August 4th Continues strong
breeze and overcast - Landed three
boats and went up the Bay
Land no whales but some eggs
and lumber for beds

Saturday August 5th Continues strong
from the ESE with some showers
Landed two boats for whales
Land one did not get fast at -
Indies came on board
