Saturday March 10
Thought this day
a strong Gale and squally
from ESE & S of head of the
Bay on the Port tack

Sunday March 11
Continues a
strong gale and heavy
rain from the E first
and middle part being
under short sail. Later
part steering to the S.W.
under a close reef. Main
top sail
Lost 33 1/2
Ton 175-09

Monday March 12
Thought this
day a strong Gale and squa-
lly with heavy Rain Ship
lying under a close reef
Main top sail on the both
different tacks Lost 34-39

Tuesday March 13
First part
more moderate ship heading
S.W. under a close reef
Main top sail. Middle
part came to heading N.W.
a strong breeze from the E.V.E.
at three A.M. made sail and
steared of to the S.W. at nine
A.M. rose the land and steared
in for Doubled Bay thick over-
cast weather at five P.M. came
to with Port anchor in the
mouth of the passage

at the Bay of Islands 1877

Wednesday March 14
Ship lying at
anchor fine weather Crew employed
cleaning ship and side

Thursday March 15
Strong breeze from
the S.E. with rain squalls Crew
employed gutting water and
bleaking out the after hold and
Monday full water

Friday March 16
Ship lying at anchor
Crew employed gutting water and
stowing it. Squalls gutting water
a strong breeze from the E with rain

Saturday March 17
Ship lying at anchor
Crew employed cleaning yards &
at three P.M. got under way
and ran out of the Harbor
with the sails a light air from
the S.W.

Sunday March 18
Fine weather and
a light air from the W. Ship heading
to the E bound to the Bay of
Islands

Monday March 19
First part a moderate
breeze from the S.W. with rain
later part clear and a light breeze
Ship heading in to the Bay of Islands
at dark passed the mine pier
