The bark Danerlane came in at ten the sea account passed the nine pin a fresh breeze from the SW ship heading ESE so ends this day

First part a fresh breeze from the S ship heading ESE all sail set middle part a strong breeze and squally double reefed the foresails wind hauled to the SE ship heading ESE later part more moderate set all sail heading ESE

Thursday April 5
First part a fresh breeze from the SE ship on the port-tack heading SEW middle part on the Harbord tack heading ESE later part at eight the rose sperm whaler loared three souls the Harbord boat went on picked the whale and got stove took the stoven boat on board and stood to the S

Friday April 6th
At two the rose the whales again loared two boats the Harbord boat struck whale sounded heavy and line parted came on board and went on the port-tack heading SEW later part of this day a fresh breeze and fine weather from E ship heading SE all sail set the Capt employed repairing the stoven boat

Saturday April 7
First part a fresh breeze from E ship heading SE all sail set middle part wind hauled to the SE ship heading ESE later part the same wind increasing finished repairing the boat and put her on the house

Throught this day a strong breeze and squally from the SEW ship heading ESE. Coasting badly and shipping water no observations
