First part moderate and fine from the SW finished boiling middle part a strong sea and squally. Later part a fresh breeze thick with rain. Wind SW. Look in light sails and double reefed. Afraid that we could not fetch St. Brendan to the W. So kept off and steered to the N

George Slaton ordinary seaman was sent to the wheel acknowledged himself incapable of steering the ship

Sunday July 8

First part a strong gale with rain from the SW. Ship heading NE. Middle part laying under a close reef. Rain ceased. Heading SE. Later part a light air from NW. Ship heading

Long 63-38

Monday July 9

Came in with a light air from the NW. Ship heading N. at two P.M. rose strong. Whales leaved two boats did not get fast at sunset. Came on board whales going quick to windward. Middle and later part calm. Flooded the oil

Tuesday July 10

Brought this day a moderate breeze from the SW. Ship heading NW. All sail set. Crew employed at Skrapeney masts

Lat 34-11

Long 64-54

Wednesday July 11

Continued a moderate breeze from the SW. Ship heading NW

Lat 35-28

Long 65-30

July 12

First part a moderate breeze from the SW. Ship heading NW. Middle part fresh. Later part falling with heavy rain squalls. No observations

Friday July 13

First part thick drizzling with squalls. Spoke a brig. got his longitude. He had not got the sun for two days. Supposed longitude was 37-30

Middle part hailing from the NE and N. Later part a light breeze from the N. Ship heading NW

Long 68-54
