

1878 Remarks on Board Back Notched Pears

Saturday Jan 14th Lat 37 45, Long 75 15 Wed
Commences with light breeze from S
East steering from point North East
to N by W, wind veered to N by W and to West
to S by W wind heading N by W employed
making time. Saw Porpoises m. d. 14
Heading East latter light breeze from South
to S by W steering N by E by West with a
fair sail employed in breaking and water
One Sail & Porpoises seen

Sunday Jan 13th Lat 37.14 Long 75.29
Commenced with light breeze from South steering from E by S to E by N. With all sails set showing sail at sundown. One Tail killers & Porpoises seen. The new ship at 12 m. ship back rather fast. Breeze from South steering E by S at dusk made the land (off of Maine) bearing E by South saw a fire at sea

Sunday Jan 14th Left 38.00 Spent
from 74.15
Commenced with fresh Breeze from South
at noon was ship heading N. E. with
with clouds raised Sails & Coarses
Plenty of Boats were seen middle heading
N. E. Wind rather moderate Breeze from S. E.
Heaving N. E. Wind to her work ship heading
E. S. E. with all sail set unless the jib making
Sinnith one sail & Boatswain & Blackbird on

1878 Cruising off Chili

Sailed Glasgow 11th Oct 37-21
 Commenced with light breeze from South.
 Heading E by N first (breeze) and running
 with tide and first breeze worked sail at
 1st down in 4. made ship at one heading
 West. latter light breeze from S. S. Part of
 West sailing. Part of steering South with all
 sail out the fresh breeze sight steering the vessel

Wednesday Jan 16th Lat 37.25 South
Long 73.15 West
Commenced with light breeze from West
So W. & W. S. W. turning South with all sail set
Employed in making line & given Perry in
sight & line once and gave signal. Perov's
then directly heading South rather light breeze
from West steering South with all sail set
Employed in making line & given Perry
in sight. Finlaks & Grandpers seen

Thursday June 1st 1840 Lat 33. 03 Long 75 28. Went
Commenced with light breeze from West
bleaching & the wind will sail out empty
at 10 making time to the fresh bay in
sight saw 3 manures in case of my gun
later light air from West steering South at 11 1/2
Raised 3 or 4 whales going to windward the fresh
Bay in sight


 Huddy star 18 Feb 38 or
 Commences with light breeze from West to West
 + 2 1/2 covered the Boats for the boats going
 to West the fresh Puffs Boats in pursuit as
 well to 6 1/2 of the light got good ground

 1 1/2 more did the light at 2 meeting for West latter
 fresh breeze from N N West to West near by from
 West to S S West at 2 1/2 rained when they were going to Winchman
 much to 11 rained another going the same at 12 covered for fresh
 got to winchman at 2 to go down (to other side) in
