Saturday June 19th 1854 Lat 40° 52' N Long 70° 10' W
Commenced with strong trade from E. S. East
So S. East heading South and in the fore
topward and sail & reefing & it ad sundown
Tacked ship & took in light sails and any
thing over on all making & E. East later
Tacking Brags from E. S. East over ship heading
S. S. East but from fore sail & back and
water & back and nothing over

Sunday June 20th Lat 40° 05' N Long 70° 32' W
Commenced with strong Brags from E. S. East
South heading & by land employed in getting
out water and anything over on all heading
S. S. East latter strong trade from E. S. East
heading S. S. East with double reefed topsails
& foresail set saw Finbacks

Monday July 1st 1854 Lat 41° 18' N Long 70° 10' W
Commenced with strong trade from E. S. East
Heading South with reefed topsails & foresail
nothing & note transpire of middle heading
South latter strong trade from E. S. East heading
S. S. East with double reefed topsails & courses
set saw Finbacks

Tuesday July 2nd 1854 Lat 42° 00' N Long 70° 41' W
Commenced with strong trade from East
to E. S. East heading from S. S. East to S. East
Spoke the ship Barin Branters of Thompson
from New York nothing over on all
transpire of middle heading S. S. East latter
with the strong trade from East
heading S. S. East school reefs and main
topsail & set flying jib saw Finbacks

Wednesday July 3rd 1854 Lat 42° 11' N Long 71° 13' W
Commenced with strong trade with rain
squalls from East to E. S. East heading from
South to S. S. East employed in making stow
& stow down and making topsail & Finbacks
Saw middle heading S. S. East latter fresh trade
from East heading S. S. East with whole topsails
set and anything over

Thursday July 4th 1854 Lat 43° 32' N Long 71° 46' W
Commenced with fresh trade from East heading
S. S. East & 5/8 set main top gallant set out
all the old foresail saw Finbacks in the
head 40° E. S. East light trade from
East heading S. S. East set all sail

Friday July 5th 1854 Lat 44° 00' N Long 72° 00' W
Commenced with light trade from E. S. East
South heading & by land with all sail set
Saw Finbacks in the light from S. S. East
1. S. S. East latter light Brags from E. S. East
heading S. S. East with all sail set pointed
the Bar Board saw Finbacks

Saturday July 6th 1854 Lat 45° 00' N Long 72° 00' W
Commenced with light Brags from East
to E. S. East heading from S. S. East to S. East
Spoke all sail set pointed the two Boats on
the shore in late wind passed in two stow down
latter light Brags from East stow down set down
The main top gallant sail & reefed it and set out

Sunday July 7th 1854 Lat 45° 48' N Long 71° 09' W
Commenced with light winds from North to N. E. East
during & set taught the head stays forward & down
down took in the light sails on all opening East
latter light Brags from N. E. East strong heading
South and anything over
