 in sight

Tuesday Mar 25th Lat 36°36' Long 74°05' West
 First port light Breeze from West steering S. E. by
 West employed in working the ship inside &
 out in sight Middle latter latter
 light Breeze from West steering S. E. by West
 employed in working the outside East in sight

Wednesday Mar 26th Lat 36°36' Long 73°32' West
 First port light Breeze from West steering S. E. by
 East employed in working the ship outside 15°
 out in sight Middle wind hauled to South latter
 light Breeze from S. East at 8 sight the land
 Cape got the Anchors off the Port & got up the
 Cables 3 sail in sight

Thursday Mar 27th First port light Breeze
 from South at 1 passed by gunnery & arrived
 up the Bay at 6 dropped the Anchor in
 latter water & the Capt went on shore
 latter employed in working in the afternoon to get the
 Bobs by Bobs and set the Bowsprit and the Cruisers
 Ashore

Friday Mar 28th Last port employed in getting
 the Bobs out of the Bowsprit & sent them Ashore
 & one of the Cruisers Commenced to break out in
 the After hold latter employed in stowing the
 after hold
