

Sunday April the 25th the 1846
the first part strong gales from N.E.
steering S.W. at 3 P.M. took in the fore
top-sail and fore sail and luffed to the N.W.
under close reefed top-sail at 12 P.M. shipped
a sea and rode in the gangway bound at
daylight rorderated some at 8 A.M. set the
fore top-sail and fore sail and steard of W by S
so ends lat by Obs 36° 54' Lon by the 69° 30'

Monday April the 26th the 1846
the first part moderate winds from N.E.
and rugged steering S.W. by W. all hands
employed in ~~in~~ luffing out. break and water
middle and latter rainey, so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 48' N Lon by the 69° 00' W

Tuesday April the 27th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from N.E.
with some light rain steering S.W. by W.
saw several sails middle the same latter
strong winds from W heading S.W. rode
the citing falls so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 28' N Lon by the 70° 00' W

Wednesday April the 28th the 1847
the first part strong winds from W.S.W.
heading S.W. middle and latter the same
saw several sails so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 00' N Lon by the 71° 00' W

Thursday April the 29th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from the N steering
W by N. set up the fore and top-mast rigging
middle part steard W till 2 P.M. the shifted
to S.W. heading to the westward at
saw doubled reefed the top-sails so ends
no lat

Friday April the 30th the 1847
the first part strong gales from S.W. wore
ship to S.E. took in to a close reefed top-sail
middle the same at 6 A.M. the winds shifted
to the north in a squet at 8 A.M. cleared up
set the fore sail and fore top-sail steard of W
so ends lat by Obs 35° 29.8' Lon 71° 30' W

Saturday May the 1st the 1847
the first part moderate winds from the N
steering S.W. set up the head-rigging middle
the same latter light winds from S.E. steering
S.W. so ends this day Lat 34° 42' N Lon 71° 45'

Sunday May the 2nd the 1846
the first part light winds from N.E. steering
S.W. saw one sail middle the same latter
at 11 A.M. the wind shifted to the south and
rainey tucked to the Eastward so ends this day

Monday May the 3rd the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from S steering
S by S at 3 P.M. luffed up saw several fin backs
and one sail at sunset took in sail heading
S.E. middle the same at day-light made sail
wind from S.W. heading S.W. the watches
employed in macing boat's sails and other things
to numerous to mention so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 04' N Lon by the 71° 25' W

Tuesday May the 4th the 1847
the first light wind from the south
and veering and thick weather heading
to the Eastward saw several sails at sunset
took in sail middle the same latter at
daylight made sail latter steard of S by E
the watches employed in macing the
backstays so ends this day

Wednesday May the 5th the 1847
the first part strong winds from S.W.
and rainey steering N.E. by E saw one
sail at sunset took sail and took
up the west boat and luffed to
the wing top E. the middle the same
latter light winds all round the compass
with heavy rain so ends this day

Thursday May the 6th the 1847
the first part light winds and calms and
a heavy sea running the middle and latter
strong gales from the south on different
backs so ends this day
