

Friday May the 7th the 1847
the first strong gale from
the S heading W by W under close
reefed topsail the middle and
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 14' N Lon by Ch 69° 14'

Saturday May the 8th the 1847
the first strong winds from S W
heading W by W at 2 pm upper ship
at 4 pm moderated set the fore
sail and steered E by E middle the same
latter good weather made all sail
heading to the south saw several
sails the watches imployed in bracing
out bread and water so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 10' N Lon by Ch 67° 37'

Sunday May the 9th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
S W steering S E by E at sunset took
in sail middle the same at daylight
made sail latter light winds from
the South heading to the eastward
by the wind so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 45' N Lon by Ch 66° 46'

Monday May the 10th the 1847
the first light winds from S E
heading E by E at sunset took in
sail middle and latter the same saw
several sails the watches in ships
duty so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 05' N Lon by Ch 66° 05'

Tuesday May the 11th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from S E and veering heading to
Eastward at sunset took in sail
the middle the same at daylight
made sail at 2 pm saw breeches
off the weather gale took ship
did not see them again the
watches imployed in fitting fluke
rope and other things too numerous
to mention so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 45' N

Wednesday May the 12th the 1847
this day begins with fresh winds
from S E with squalls of rain
heading E by E at 5 pm took in
all sail to a close reef main topsail
middle the same at daylight set
the fore topsail and fore sail and
hoisted two reefs out of the main top
sail later moderate the watches
in plowing in setting up rigging so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 40' N Lon by Ch 66° 16' W

Thursday May the 13th the 1847
the first part light winds from
S E heading E at sunset took in sail
middle the same at daylight made sail
latter moderate winds from S W steering
S E saw three sails the watches imployed
in plating unit so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 26' N Lon by Ch 65° 14' W

Friday May the 14th the 1847
the first part in fore breeze from S W
steering S E at sunset took in sail middle
and latter the same at daylight made
sail the watches imployed in ships duty
so ends Lat by Obs 34° 14' N Lon by Ch 63° 46'

Saturday May the 15th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
the South head to the Eastward by
the winds at 4 pm took in the main
topgallant sail at sunset took in
for the night the middle
at day but light mad sail
of rain so ends

Sunday May the 16th the 1847
the first part strong winds from S W
heading S E at sunset took in sail
for the night the middle the same at day
light made sail the watches in ships
duty so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 55' N Lon by Ch 61° 28'
that Lat is too high weather and
no table cloth
