

Monday May the 17th the 1847
the first part strong winds from S.W.
steering S.W. at sunset took in the
fore topsail and close reefed the main
the middle and latter the same
at daylight set the fore topsail
and turned one reef out of the
main the watches imploded in
plating sinit so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 06' N Lon by Obs 60° 09' W

Tuesday May the 18th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
the south heading S.E. at sunset
took in sail the middle the same
at daylight set the fore topsail
latter the wind from S.W.
heading S.E. set mainsail gill and
spanker so ends this day
Lat by Obs 32° 38' N Lon by Obs 57° 03' W

Wednesday May the 19th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from S.W. Breeze heading S.E.
at sunset took in sail the middle
and latter the same at daylight made
sail the watches imploded in setting up
the head stay, caught a dolphin so ends

Thursday May the 20th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
the south with some squalls of rain
at sunset took in sail and wore ship
middle the very rainy latter some
squalls of rain steering to the northward
so ends this day

Friday May the 21st the 1847
the first part strong winds from
from the south steering different
courses at 3 PM saw humpback
at sunset took in sail heading
S.E. middle and latter wind
the same and very rainy
so ends this day

Saturday May the 22nd the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
S and veering with heavy rain heading
to the Westward the middle the same
latter strong winds from S broke out for
water at noon set the fore topsail dyed
reefed and turned one reef out of the main
topsail and steered S.W. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 07' N Lon by Obs 58° 16' W

Sunday May the 23rd the 1847
the first part strong winds from the S.W.
steering S.W. at 2 PM saw black pick hard
but did not see them again came on
board steered S.W. at sunset took in sail
and luffed to the wind to the westward
cast a porpoise the middle and latter
moderate winds from S.W. at daylight
made sail steered S.W. at noon saw black
fish large and struck one and killed
and took him along side & salted and lost
so ends Lat by Obs 33° 45' N Lon by Obs 58° 40' W

Monday May the 24th the 1847
the first part light winds from
W.N.W. heading S.W. at sunset took in
sail the middle the wind from West
at daylight made sail heading to the
northward latter the same the watches
imploded in boiling the black fish so ends
Lat by Obs 33° 57' N Lon by Obs

Tuesday May the 25th the 1847
the first part light winds from S.W.
steering S.W. sent up the fore top gale
ant mast at sunset took in sail and
wore ship middle wind the same at
noon wore ship at daylight made
sail steered S.W. sent up the fore top
gale ant mast and set up the
main topmast rigging and to the gale ant
stays and back stays so ends this day
