Thursday May the 27th the 1847
the first part light winds from W
steering S.E. the watches imployed
in setting up rig at sunset took
in sail and wore ship to the north

made sail steard N.E. imployed in
bracing out water and the old
gib and topsail so ends this day
Sat by Ob 35° 55' N Lon by Ob 59° 05'

Friday May the 28th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
W.N.W. steering N.E. the watches
imployed in mending the gib and
topsail at sunset took in sail and
and luffed to the wind to the N
the middle the same latter the
rig from the north steering S by N
the watches imployed in setting up
rig so ends this day
Sat by Ob 34° 53' N Lon by Ob

Saturday May the 29th the 1847
the first part light winds from
the north steering S by N sent
back at sunset took in sail the middle
the same at daylight made sail
the weather fresh wind all round
the compass latter strong winds from
S.W. steering S.E. at 11 a.m. put one
reef in the topsails so ends this day

Sunday May the 30th the 1847
the first part strong winds from W
steering S.E. at 3 a.m. its increased to
a gale took in every thing to a close
reefed main topsail and luffed to the wind
to the southward the middle moderate
at sunrise made sail latter light winds from
the N steering S.E. so ends this day
Sat by Ob 34° 38' N Lon by Ob 56° 13' W

Monday May the 31st the 1847
the first part light winds from the N
steering S.E. at 5 a.m. the wind shifted to
S.W. with some light rain at sunset took in
sail the middle the same with heavy
rain at daylight strong winds and squalls
at 9 a.m. moderate gale sail steard
E.S. the watches imployed in bracing out
for bread so ends this day
Sat by Ob

Tuesday June the 1st the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
W.N.W. steering S.E. at 4 a.m. thickened up
and breaced up strong took in gib and
topsail and doubled reefed the topsail
at sunset took in sail to a close reef
topsail and luffed to the wind to the E
middle strong winds from N.E. and raged
at daylight set doubled reefed topsails
and and fore sail latter the same winds
Sat by Ob 35° 15' N Lon by Ob 53° 53'

Wednesday June the 2nd the 1847
the first part strong winds from E.S.E.
heading N.E. set gib and topsail and mended
sail the watches in ship's duty at sun
set took in sail the middle the same at
at day made sail latter the wind fresh
top E heading S.W. the ~~boat~~ in the stern
boat and put it over head at 11 a.m.
tacked ship so ends this day
Sat by Ob 32° 04' N Lon by Ob 53° 53' W
