

Thursday the 8th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from S E heading 4/8 E at sunset
took in sail for the night the middle
the same at daylight made sail
latter a fresh breeze from S steering
E by S saw a brig standing to the
westward the watches in ships duty so ends
Sat by Obs 52° 54' N Lon by the 53° 10'

Friday the 9th the 1847
the first part light winds from
the South steering E by S at sunset
took in sail the middle the same
at daylight made sail latter calm the
watches employed in bracing out the all
main topsail and foresail and repairing
them so ends this day
Sat by Obs 52° 13' N Lon by the 53° 00'

Saturday the 10th the 1847
the first part light winds from
the S steering E by S bent the all
main topsail and foresail at sunset
took in sail the middle the same at
daylight made sail steard E saw
saw a schooner the watches in ships duty
Sat by Obs 52° 40' N Lon by the 53° 50'

Sunday June the 11th the 1847
the first part light winds from the
S W steering E at sunset took in sail
the middle some squalls of rain at day
light made sail steard E by S so ends
Sat by Obs 52° 08' N Lon by the 54° 30' W

Monday June the 12th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from S W
steering E saw a schooner at sunset
took in sail middle the wind from S W
heading S E at day light made sail
latter the same the watches employed
in turning up the top mast origin
and setting up the 3 so ends
Sat by Obs 53° 00' N Lon by the 48° 00'

Monday June the 8th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from S W
heading S E shortened the fore stay and
set it up at 5 PM tacked ship at sun
set took in sail middle the same
at daylight made sail the wind from
S W heading West employed in setting
the head stays so ends this day
Sat by Obs 52° 42' N Lon by the 47° 12'

Monday June the 9th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from S W
heading S W set up the top galant origin
at sunset took in sail the middle the
same at daylight made sail heading S W
by the wind saw two sails to the wind beam
standing to the Eastward at 8 PM tacked
ship the watches employed in bracing out
for water so ends this day
Sat by Obs 52° 29' N

Thursday June the 10th the 1847
the first part a strong wind from S W
heading S E some squalls of rain at sunset
took in sail heading S E the middle good
weather at daylight made sail one sail
in sight the brig heading E by S by the wind
the watches in ships duty so ends this day
Sat by Obs 52° 54' N Lon by the 48° 00'

Friday June the 11th the 1847
the first part light winds from S E
heading E at 5 PM spoke the schooner
Belisle of Provincetown Capt Cook
4 months out 110 lbs of oil the Capt came
on board at sunset took in sail the
middle and latter light winds from the
Southward heading to ship Eastward at
daylight made sail the schooner in
sight the watches employed in repairing
the fore and main mast so ends this day
Sat by Obs 53° 00' N Lon by the 47° 00'
