

Saturday June the 12th the 1847
the first part light winds from
the southward heading to the Eastward
the schooner and one other sail in
sight at sunset took in sail the
middle calm at daylight made sail
latter calm the watches implor'd in
turning up the fore rigging three sails
in sight so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 28' N Lon by the 46° 51'

Sunday June the 13th the 1847
the first part calm fore sails
sails in sight at sunset took in
the light sails the middle the same
at daylight made sail latter light winds
from the E heading to the South by
the wind four sails in sight at 10 am
spoke the Brig Eratto the cap went
on board and got some oranges and
a pig and came on board so ends
Lat by Obs

Monday June the 14th the 1847
the first part light winds from East
heading to the Northward at sunset took
in sail middle and latter calm several
sails in sight the watches implor'd in
turning up the main rigging so ends
Lat by Obs

Tuesday June the 15th the 1847
the first part calm at 3 pm took
alight breeze from the N heading
60° E at 5 pm a boat boarded us
from a brig from Gibraltar bound
to New York let him have half
a barrel of meat at sunset took
in sail through the night
the same at daylight made sail
heading to the S E by the wind
two sails in sight at 7 am spoke
ship the watches implor'd in bracing
out for water so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 41' N

Wednesday June the 16th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
East heading 100° E at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at daylight
made sail latter the same the watches
implor'd in putting on the shear poles
and mizen spinnaker so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 52' N Lon by the 45° 29'

Thursday June the 17th the 1847
the first part light winds from E & E
heading 90° E at sunset took in sail
the middle the same at daylight made
sail at 9 am took in W at 10 am spoke
the Brig Lutherwood Capt. Lusk on 20
months out 200 bbls of oil the capt came
on board so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 03' N Lon 45° 57' W

Friday June the 18th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
the S heading W S W at sunset took
in sail at 9 am the capt came on
board his vessel again the middle the
same at daylight made sail the watches
implor'd in capping the rigging latter a
fresh breeze from S W heading W
the Lutherwood in sight so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 00' N

Saturday June the 19th the 1847
the first part light winds from
S W heading W surved the fore
and main sails at sunset took in
sail middle a fresh breeze from South
at daylight made sail latter strong
winds and rugged at 10 am put one
reef in the top sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 24' N Lon by the 48°

Sunday June the 20th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
heading 90° S W at sunset took in sail
the middle and latter strong winds
and rugged at 10 am set the mainsail
and top sail so ends Lat 33° 53' N Lon 49° 20'
