

Monday June the 21st the 1847
the first part strong winds from
SSE heading S W the latter wind
in sight at sunset took in the
crosser middle the same at daylight
set the foresail and trysail broke
fore water at 10 am moderated turned
one reef out of each top sail heading
S W by S by the wind the watches
imploded in rattle the fore and main
riggin so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 24' Lon by Ch 79° 05'

Tuesday June the 22nd the 1847
the first part a strong wind from
SSE steering W by compass at sunset
took in sail and luffed to the S W
middle some squalls of rain at day
light made set the foresail the watches
imploded in stripping the fore and main
sweeters and running them over saw
one sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 35' 14" W Lon by Ch 79° 50' 37"

Wednesday June the 23rd the 1847
the first part strong winds from
ESE heading S W at sunset took in
the fore sail and trysail and wore
ship the middle the same at 10 am
wore ship at daylight made sail fore
sail and trysail at 10 set the main
sail the watches imploded in rattle down
the fore and main riggin one sail in
sight so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 06' Lon by Ch 80° 23'

Thursday June the 24th the 1847
the first part a moderate breeze
from ESE heading S W at 6 am took
at sunset took in sail the middle
the same at daylight made sail two sails
in sight latter almost calm the watches
imploded in rattle the topmast riggin
so ends this day

Friday June the 25th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
SE heading ESE set up the bob stays
at sunset took in sail middle the
wind from S W heading S E at day
light made sail latter strong wind
S W heading SE the watches imploded
in drawing sail sweating riggin so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 24' Lon by Ch 79° 05'

Saturday June the 26th the 1847
the first part a strong wind from S W
heading S E at 5 PM spoke the Brig
Colon Capt. ~~Thomson~~ 1466 the Capt
came on board at 6 returned at sunset
took in sail middle wind the same some
squalls of rain at sunrise made sail steard
S E imploded in setting up the head stays
and fitting new martenail gies so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 04' Lon by Ch 77° 50'

Sunday June the 27th the 1847
the first part a strong winds from S W
steering S W at sunset took in sail
and luffed to the wind the middle
the same at daylight made sail
heading S W S E so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 49'

Monday June the 28th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
S W steering S W E from compass
at sunset took in sail and luffed to
the wind middle the same at daylight
made sail heading to the S by
the wind the watches imploded in rattle
the topmast riggin and martenail
yarn saw one sail steering to the Eastward
so ends Lat by

Tuesday June the 29th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from S W
heading S at 9 PM saw black fish band struck
one war boat and druid came on board at sun
set took in sail middle and latter the same
at daylight made sail so ends this day
