

This day William
Carver off duty sick

Monday, June the 30th the 1847
the first part light winds from
W & W heading, I saw one sail the
watcher impleid in main spinnaker
and other things too numerous to mention
at 6 PM wore ship at sunset took
in sail the middle and latter nearly
calm at daylight made sail heading to
the S W the watcher impleid in bracing
out water and filled three cask of salt
water so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 18' N Lon by Ch 51° 02'

Thursday July the 4th the 1847
the first part calm the watcher
impleid in putting up new junks
and noting yards at sunset took in
sail middle and the same at day
light made sail with a light breeze
from S E heading S W saw plenty
of grampses and one sail, set up
the main stay so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 10' N Lon by Ch 47° 44'

Friday July the 5th the 1847
the first part light winds from
E heading S E at 2 PM saw black
fish board and chased could not get
fast at 4 PM on board at sunset
took in sail middle the same at 12 PM
wore ship at daylight made sail at 5 PM
tacked the watcher impleid in surring
the lanyards to the main rig and getting
it up saw plenty of squids so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 56' N Lon by Ch 49° 50'

Saturday July the 6th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
S E heading S W at sunset took in sail
through the night the same on different
tacks at daylight made sail one sail
in sight at 6 AM tacked ship so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 58' N Lon by Ch 51° 04'

Sunday July the 7th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from the S heading S W at sunset
took in sail the middle and latter
the same at daylight made sail at 5 PM
spoke a brig from Yalapa saw one
other sail the brig heading E N E so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 18' N Lon by Ch 51° 02'

Monday July the 8th the 1847
the first part nearly calm heading
W & W at 1 PM wore ship at sunset
took in sail the middle the same at
daylight made sail wind from heading
E N E the watcher impleid in surring
the lanyards to the foregin and getting
it up saw several sails so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 20' N Lon by Ch 52° 36' W

Monday July the 6th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from S W
heading S E several sails in sight at 6 PM
had a squall took in main top gallant sail
at sunset took in sail for the night the
middle the same at daylight made sail
heading the S E by the wind at 9 AM
tacked ship at 10 spoke the brig Mexico
the capt. came on board tacked ship
so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 50' N Lon by Ch 49° 25'

Wednesday July the 7th the 1847
the first part a moderate wind from
W heading S E at sunset took in
sail the went on board the middle
and latter strong winds from W & W at
daylight made sail heading the Mexico
in sight at 3 AM capt off E N E so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 10' N Lon by Ch 46° 08'

Thursday July the 8th the 1847
the first part strong winds from W & W steering
E N E at sunset took in sail spoke the Mexico the
middle and latter the wind W & W with squalls
of rain at daylight made sail steered E N E
sent down the main top gallant yard to fit the
rig so ends Lat 35° 18' N Lon 45° 55'
