

Thursday July the 9th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
the W steering ESE at 10 m. had
put two reefs in the topsails and
began to the wind at the 10 m. W at
6 m. spoke the Mexico more ship
and hauled up the fore sail middle
the same at daylight set the fore
sail at 10 m. more ship latter squall
at 10 m. ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 17' Lon by Ch 45° 00'

Friday July the 10th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
the westward with heavy squalls of
rain took in the fore sail heading
W by the wind reefed the try
sail and set it at sunset spoke
the Mexico middle the same at daylight
made sail sent up the main top
galant yard and sail made latter morder
the wind from W heading NW W ends
Lat by Obs

Saturday July the 11th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
S W to W with some rain heading
to the westward West by the wind
at sunset spoke the Mexico and took
in sail the middle the same at day
light set the gib and sprinker and
turned one reef out of the top sail at
10 m. had a squall took in gib and
trysail cleared up the fore top sail
so ends Lat by Obs 35° 12'

Sunday July the 12th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
the W and squalls heading NW W
at sunset took in the fore sail
and reefed the trysail the middle
more moderate at daylight made
sail latter light winds from NW E
heading SW W ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 04' Lon by Ch 46° 12'

Tuesday July the 13th the 1847
the first part light winds from
NW E heading NW W at sunset took
in sail and spoke the Mexico middle
the same at daylight made sail the
from the south steering NW E so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 50' Lon by Ch

Wednesday July the 14th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
the S and thick weather steering
SE at 3 m. spoke the Barkley
Capt King & months out clean
the Capt went on board at sunset
took sail and the Capt came on board
the middle the same at daylight made
sail three reefs in sail at 6 m. more
ship to the SE wind from NW
with squalls of rain so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 15' 38' Lon by Ch 46° 37'

Thursday July the 15th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
S W heading SE at sunset took in
the courses the middle the same at day
light made sail one reef in right latter
more moderate so ends this day

Friday July the 16th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
S W heading SE at 6 m. spoke the
Cuthbert the Capt came on board
at sunset took in sail latter
middle the same at daylight made
sail cleared S E sent down the fore
top sail to repair so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 46' 18' Lon by Ch 45° 14'

Saturday July the 17th the 1847
the first part nearly calm steering
SE the watches in plain in mending
the fore top sail at 4 m. sent it
up and sent it at sunset took in
in sail the middle and latter the
same at daylight made sail sent down
the fore sail and repaired it and sent it up
so ends Lat by Obs 35° 07' Lon by Ch 44° 49'
