

Sunday July the 19th the 1847
the first part light winds from
W. & heading to the Eastward at sunset
took in sail the middle and latter the
same at daylight made sail saw porpo-
ses and gampages so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 37' N Lon by Ch 44° 40'

Monday July the 17th the 1847
the first part nearly calm steering
to the East by the wind at sunset
took in sail middle light winds from W. & W
heading at daylight made sail saw
one sail the watches impland in painting
the mast boat and taring the head
stays wends this day and no whales nor
signs of any Lat 36° 06' N Lon 44° 15' W

Tuesday June the 20th the 1846
the first part light winds from
W. & steering W. & the watches impland
in taring rig in at sunset took in
sail middle same rain at day light
made sail at daylight 10 AM had
a squall put one reef in the topsails
so ends

Wednesday July the 21st the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
W. & W and rainey heading W. & W
at 10 PM doubled reefed saw plenty
of birds at sunset took in sail and
more ship middle the same at daylight
the wind hauled to the E made sail
heading W. & W at 6 AM wore ship the
watches impland in taring so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 26' N Lon by Ch 43° 40'

Thursday July the 22nd the 1847
the first part calm at 10 PM saw
blackfish boards and chased could not
get just come on board at sunset
took in sail the middle the same
at daylight made sail with
a light breeze from W. & W heading W
saw a long steering to the Eastward the
the watches impland in brass out water
so ends

Friday July the 23rd the 1847
the first part light winds from the
W. & heading to the W. & W at sunset
took in sail the middle the same
at daylight made sail latter the
wind from W. & heading E. & W ends
Lat by Obs 35° 38' N Lon by Ch 45° 55'

Saturday July the 24th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from W. & W heading E at 6 PM tacked
ship to W. & W at sunset took in sail
the middle a fresh breeze from W. & W
heading W. & W at daylight made sail
latter the same painted the salar
boat so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 42' N Lon by Ch 45° 15'

Sunday July the 25th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
W. & W heading W. & W by W at sunset
took in sail the middle and latter the
same at daylight made sail so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 00' N Lon by Ch 46° 41'

Monday July the 26th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
the W heading W. & W at 10 PM tacked
at 3 PM the wind hauled to E. & W
tacked again at sunset took in sail
the middle and latter the same
at daylight made sail painted the
salvage boat so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 46' N Lon by Ch 47° 21'

Tuesday July the 27th the 1847
the first part light winds from
W. & heading W. & W at 10 PM tacked ship
at sunset took in sail for this night
middle the same at 10 PM tacked at day
light made sail the watches impland
in brass out molasses and meal on
different tanks so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 49' N Lon by Ch 47° 25'
